

Church Ministry

Program Description

Columbia's **Church Ministry degree** is designed for students preparing to serve the local church. This program is built on Columbia's practical theology core curriculum, that helps students to develop a Christ-centered identity as well as grow in their clarity and confidence regarding the unique contribution they can make. The Church Ministry degree equips students to lead with a broad range of ministry skills, while also giving students the opportunity to gain a more specific skill-set by completing a concentration in one of three areas: Youth Ministry, Worship Arts, or Biblical Studies. The Church Ministry degree is suitable for any student who loves God, loves people, is oriented toward service, and has a desire to see the church thrive.

Program Objectives

- 1. Students will develop a biblical definition of ministry that leads to practical engagement with the local church.
- 2. Students will grow in their ability to maintain an other-centered posture that listens to the Spirit, cares for the congregation, engages missionally with neighbours, and converses with culture in healthy ways.
- **3.** Students will learn how to plan and implement services and events that build up the church and foster transformation.
- **4.** Students will become conversant with church structure, polity, budgeting, and the practicalities of running a complex organization.
- **5.** Students will explore self-management, self-care, and spiritual formation—increasing their personal spiritual, physical, and mental health so as to be better able to serve others.
