# Job Description: Travelling Ministry Team Leader



## Worship Arts Leaders are required to meet the following expectations:

- They must be a mature, responsible student, who is respected within the CBC community.
- They are expected to uphold all CBC community standards.
- They are expected to have completed at least one year of academic studies at CBC.
- They are expected to have a 2.5 cumulative GPA.

## **Compensation:**

- The TMT Leader will receive a \$2000.00 stipend for the academic year.
- The TMT Leader may be eligible to receive Service Practicum or Internship credit for their role.

**Commitment**: September – April; approx. 12 – 15 hours per week

## Responsibilities:

#### Auditions and team selection:

 Attend music auditions during orientation week and work with faculty and other ministry team leaders in the discernment process for putting ministry teams together.

# Team Building:

- Work with the faculty supervisor in planning and implementing team events such as the fall retreat day in September
- Work with the faculty supervisor in choosing a team 'uniform' and lead team on a shopping trip for the purchase of clothing.
- Purposefully develop peer mentoring relationships with members of your ministry team to encourage, challenge, and lead in such a way that there is a strong sense of team support, respect and accountability for effective ministry.
- Plan and run rehearsals in such a way that team unity is built and maintained with good communication and times for prayer and debriefing of ministry opportunities.

#### Program planning:

- Work with the faculty supervisor in choosing music, scripture readings, prayers and other elements for both worship leading and performance sets that will be used in the team's touring ministry.
- Work with the faculty supervisor in creating service outlines for each ministry venue.
- Create necessary sound and media details as required by the venues the team visits.

#### • Team Rehearsals:

- Lead the instrumentalists and singers on your team in choosing, arranging & rehearsing both worship and performance songs, scripture readings, etc.
- Assist the faculty supervisor and your team in making sure the necessary instruments and sound equipment are set up and ready for weekly rehearsals

- Plan and lead effective rehearsals that both accomplish learning goals and develop your team in interpersonal relationships and musical skill.
- Lead 4-5 book review conversations with the team based on the required reading of "The Worshipping Artist" by Rory Noland.

## • Administration:

- Assist the faculty supervisor in the details of tour ministry. IE: travel, billeting, meals, connecting with pastors and technical support people, etc.
- o Prepare and print chord charts and other resources for team members
- Meet weekly with the Supervisor for feedback, counsel, prayer and encouragement.
- Meet weekly with other student leaders at the Wednesday afternoon Student Leadership Connection.
