

Head Coach Men's Volleyball

The mission of Columbia Bible College is to equip students for a life of discipleship, ministry, and leadership to the church and community.

Job Purpose

The Head Coach is entrusted with building a men's volleyball program of excellence, which at its core includes: the values of Bearcats Athletics, the embodiment of beliefs and behaviors that lead to winning performances and the fostering of a culture which positively impacts the student athletes experience on the court, in the classroom and in their Christian faith journey. The Head Coach will also oversee the administrative and day-to-day on goings of the men's volleyball program with the assistance of the Athletics Department.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Providing faith and character development through:
 - discipling student-athletes to a closer relationship with Jesus Christ through intentional modeling and instruction, and providing spiritual accountability,
 - teaching life skills through the medium of sport,
 - encouraging academic progress and providing academic accountability.
- Providing coaching leadership and team management through:
 - planning, preparing, and facilitating effective, challenging, and safe practice sessions,
 - teaching skills required for college level athletics participation,
 - ensuring athletes receive proper physiological preparation for their competitive environments,
 - teaching, and monitoring for, proper injury prevention techniques,
 - overseeing team transportation to required events,
 - identifying and supervising Assistant Coaches, and Team Managers.

- Assisting Athletics Administration in:
 - completing required league and CBC paperwork in a timely fashion,
 - promoting the team, as well as Columbia Athletics, within the community through networking with community organizations, high school coaches, community clubs, etc.,
 - recruitment of student-athletes,
 - the coordination of team ministry opportunities.

Qualifications

A. Education:

- Graduate of a post-secondary institution preferred.
- Have (or are working towards) being a certified Advanced Development Coach

B. Experience:

- Previous experience coaching at the collegiate or senior high school level preferred.
- Previous provincial team or club coaching an asset.

C. Skills & Abilities

- Ability to teach and coach college level student-athletes within the demands of college athletics.
- Relational skills with college student-athletes.
- Ability to work independently with minimum supervision.
- Ability to model and encourage a Christ-centered lifestyle.
- Valid driver's license.

D. Expectations

- To be a model to students in character and behaviour, as are outlined in the "Expectations & Guidelines of the CBC Community" Student Handbook.
- Agreement with and commitment to the CBC Mission Statement, BCMB or MCBC Confession of Faith, and Responsibilities of Community Membership Statement and the ABHE Religious Freedom & Human Sexuality Position Statement.
- Maintain membership in good standing in a local Christian church.
- A good team player as part of CBC Athletics, recognizing the larger team context.
- Able to maintain healthy relationships and can respect the various levels of authorization granted to staff and faculty within the organization.

- A capable leader, administrator, and communicator.
- Able to lead assistant coaches and student-athletes in a godly manner, always seeking the good for the development of the student-athlete.

Limitations

- A Head Coach may not function outside the procedures and policies of CBC.
- No finances are to be spent without the approval of the Athletic Director.
- A dating or courtship relationship with a student is not permissible.

Remuneration

- Remuneration will be calculated by the Athletic Director, considering certification, years and type of experience, responsibilities, and level of coaching competence.
- This is a full year, part-time position.
- This is a 1-year contract position that may be renewable.
- Office space may be shared with other coaches and/or staff.

Statement of Relationships

A Head Coach is accountable to the Director of Athletics & Recreation as their immediate supervisor.

In the event of an unresolved conflict between the Head Coach and their immediate supervisor, the Dean of Students must be contacted to assist in resolving the conflict.

Supervision of assistant coaches and captains as assigned.
